Safety First

Safety at the club is a team effort, and this effort is particularly important during this time of uncertainty around our ability to remain at our current flying site. Over the last two months we have had a dramatic reduction in the number of times we've had to go on to Shone Farms' property to retrieve downed planes. This is outstanding and is the result of all of our efforts to remind each other to keep the planes within our borders, and to avoid flying over the vineyards. Along these lines, we recently had a situation where Ya-Ka-Ama had an event (Softball) which involved the use of the baseball field just down from the South end of our runway. Apparently there was some flying over that field when it was in use. Even though Ya-Ka-Ama did not request ahead of time that we cancel flying during the event, it is essential that — as the AMA rules state clearly — we NEVER fly over people. This issue was discussed by the WCF board during our last meeting and it has been decided that in the future, if Ya-Ka-Ama has an event that utilizes that Western-most baseball field, flying MUST be shut down immediately. Flying can resume once that field is no longer in use.

On another note, we've had some issues with some members driving too quickly on Ya-Ka-Ama property, and particularly down the gravel drive from the gate to our parking area. Not only does this create a safety issue, and disrespectfully spreads dust over members vehicles, it also conveys a lack of respect for the property we are so fortunate to have access to. If your ears are burning when you read this... SLOW DOWN! And if you see someone driving too quickly, please take a moment to give them a friendly reminder.

Again, thanks to all for the ongoing efforts to help our club maintain good relations with our landlords and neighbors, and let's continue the safe and responsible flying that puts us in the best position for holding on to this fantastic flying location.

Weather permitting (particularly if windy conditions), there will be a local control line stunt competition (Meet-n-Meat) held at Kennedy Park in Napa, CA in September. The event is held at the Jim Tichy Memorial Control Line Circle within Kennedy Park. It is also a free event to watch. Dates are as follows:

Friday Sept 20: Beginner, Intermediate and Advanced stunt classesSaturday Sept 21: Classic and Old-Time stunt classesSunday Sept 22: Expert stunt class

Even though it is a local control line competition, the Bay Area is fortunate to have quite a few expert CL pilots that live locally. These are amazing pilots with amazing model planes. Just to name a few experts, Dave Fitzgerald, Brett Buck, Dennis Nunes, Jim Arron, and our own club member Paul Pomposo. Plus, others that are equally talented. A few of these pilots have competed and won at the NATS, and also the World CL competition.


The planes that will fly at the competition will include both glow engine and electric powered control line models.

Colin McRae will be competing in the Beginner stunt class while Paul Pomposo in the Expert stunt class. Paul will be flying his newly built Imitation model that he has been flying and trimming lately at the field. The Imitation model was originally designed by Ted Fancher, and Paul built his model based on the original design. It is powered by a Super Tigre 46 glow engine. Each day, the competition starts around 8:30 am and is usually completed by noon- 1 PM.

The Classic, Intermediate, Advanced, and Expert stunt classes fly and are judged on specific control line precision aerobatic stunts as indicated here.



The Beginner and Old Time Stunt classes fly a simpler set of flight maneuvers for good reason since the full stunt pattern is quite difficult requiring well-trimmed models and superior piloting experience.

Come to Napa in September and see what real control line flying is all about!


General Meeting Minutes
